School lunch prices increase for 2011-12

The Wakefield Board of Education increased school lunch prices for students by ten cents for the upcoming 2011 – 12 school year. Lunch price for adults rose by fifteen cents for the upcoming year. Breakfast will remain at \$1.00 for students and adults. Lunch prices will be \$2.75 for adults, \$2.20 for students in grades 7 – 12, and \$1.70 for students in grades K – 6. If you wish to purchase an extra milk the cost will be 30 cents.

Optional items will continue to be available for high school students at an additional cost. Elementary students will be limited to optional items on Friday. Mrs. Foote is planning to expand our offering on the salad bar this year and she is planning to offer increased variety of foods for students to select. We are working at offering more nutritious options for students to purchase from the snack bar as well as increased offering through the school lunch program.

The school lunch program is self supporting and complies with all state and federal school lunch guidelines. Currently over 95% of our students participate in our school lunch program. Students qualifying for free or reduced meals last year 2010 – 11 will begin the year receiving free or reduced lunches. Students qualifying for free or reduced meals need to reapply each year during the month of August, if you wish to continue receiving lunch at the free or reduced prices. Failure to complete and submit the forms will result in paying for lunches at the full price rate. PLEASE REMEMBER TO FILL OUT YOUR

APPLICATION FOR FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH. Only one form per family is required. We have enclosed a free and reduced lunch application for your convenience. Please send the completed form with your student on the first day of school or feel free to drop the form off at either office.

Activity passes



Wakefield Community School offers families and students the opportunity to purchase annual passes for sporting events. The cost for a family pass (two parents and K - 12 students) is \$100. An adult single pass is \$30 and a student pass is \$20 for the 2011 – 2012 school year. College students will have to purchase a single adult pass. The goal of these three types of year long passes is to make home events at Wakefield more affordable for students, parents and adults.

The passes will be sold at the high school office and at select home volleyball games. The regular cost of admission to 2011 – 2012 Lewis and Clark Conference games is \$5.00 for adults and \$4.00 for students.

New board policies

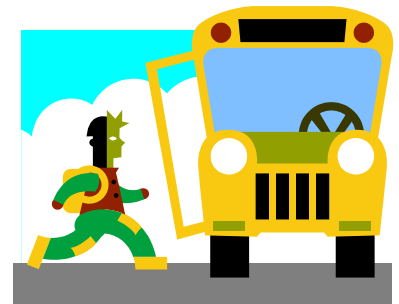

Drop off, pick up times & school safety

Student safety is a priority issue given the unfortunate times we all live. Two door entrances to school will be accessible to the public during the school day. The main entrance to the high school just north of the library and the main south entrance to the elementary are accessible to the public through the door security system. The doors in the morning will remain unlocked until school begins at 8:20 a.m. Staff will monitor the doors before and after school. The doors will reopen for parents to pick up students at 3:30 p.m. each day. When you have business at school simply go to the door buzz in system, identify yourself and the nature of your business and one of our receptionists will grant you access. We want you to feel welcome to come to school while maintaining a safe and secure learning environment for all students.

Providing accessible safe parking for patrons, staff and students is a concern for everyone. We would ask that you not park along the side of the curb in the circle drive or in the elementary parking lot. These areas are reserved for school buses and school vehicle loading and unloading. If you plan to pick up your son/daughter from school, please park in the angled parking along the north side of the elementary building on 8th street. Please refer to the maps on the next page for more information on where to park. Please remember that when you visit school, please check into the office. Keeping students and staff safe is everyone's business. Thank you for your cooperation.

Aumento De Precios de Almuerzo Escolar Para 2011 – 2012

El Consejo Educativo de Wakefield aumento de los precios de almuerzos escolares para los estudiantes por diez centavos para el próximo año escolar 2011-2012. El precio del almuerzo para los adultos aumentó por quince centavos de dólar en el siguiente año. El desayuno se mantendrá en \$ 1.00 para estudiantes y adultos. Los precios del almuerzo será de \$ 2.75 para adultos, \$ 2.20 para estudiantes en los grados 7 al 12, y \$ 1.70 para los estudiantes en los grados K - 6. Si usted desea comprar una leche extra el costo será de .30 centavos de dólar.

Los artículos opcionales se seguirán estando disponibles para estudiantes de secundaria con un costo adicional. Los estudiantes de primaria serán limitados a los artículos opcionales los viernes. La Sra. Foote tiene la intención de ampliar nuestra oferta en la barra de ensaladas de este año y tiene previsto ofrecer una mayor variedad de alimentos para que los estudiantes seleccionen. Estamos trabajando en ofrecer opciones más nutritivas para que los estudiantes compren de la barra de botanas, así como ofrecer un aumento a través del programa de almuerzos escolares.

El programa de almuerzo escolar es autosuficiente y cumple con todas las directrices estatales y federales, del

almuerzo escolar. Actualmente más del 95% de nuestros estudiantes participan en nuestro programa de almuerzos escolares. Los estudiantes que califican para recibir comidas gratis o a precio reducido el año pasado 2010-11 comenzarán el año recibiendo almuerzos gratis o a precio reducido. Pases de Actividades

Las Escuelas Wakefield ofrece a las familias y los estudiantes la oportunidad de adquirir pases anuales para los eventos deportivos. El costo de un pase familiar (dos padres y estudiantes de K-12) es de \$ 100. Un pase para adulto soltero \$ 30, y un pase de estudiante \$ 20 para el año escolar 2011-2012. Dejar- Recoger Tiempos & Seguridad Escolar

Seguridad de los estudiantes es una prioridad dado el momento desafortunado en que todos vivimos. Dos puertas de entrada a la escuela serán accesibles al público durante el día escolar. La entrada principal a la escuela secundaria, al norte de la biblioteca y la entrada principal al sur la escuela primaria son accesibles para el público a través del sistema de seguridad de la puerta. Las puertas en la mañana permanecerán abiertas hasta el inicio de clases a las 8:20 am. El personal hará un monitoreo de las puertas, antes y después de la escuela. Las puertas se abrirán de nuevo a los padres para recoger a sus estudiantes a las 3:30 pm cada día. Cuando usted tenga un asunto en la escuela simplemente vaya a la puerta y presione el timbre del sistema, identifíquese a sí mismo y la razón de su negocio y una de nuestras recepcionistas le permitirá la entrada. Queremos que se sientan bienvenidos al venir a la escuela mientras que se mantiene un ambiente de aprendizaje seguro para todos los estudiantes.

Proveer estacionamiento accesible y seguro para patronos, empleados y estudiantes es una preocupación para todos. 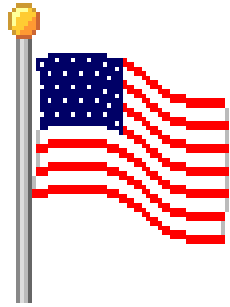
Wakefield Community School will not release the names of students to any person or organization for solicitation purposes. Any person or group requesting directory information must state the purpose for which

School year opens with traditional flag raising

The first day of school is August 16, beginning with our annual flag raising ceremony at 8:15 a.m. Students in grades 7-12 will go to the main gym for a brief assembly (after the flag-raising) followed by meetings with their class sponsors to review the student handbooks. New science teachers and new superintendent

Mr. Lundin will be teaching 7th and 8th grade science, Science Research, and Chemistry.

Mr. Mark Reimers comes to us from Fairbury, Nebraska, where he taught science for three years. Mark is a graduate of Hartington High School and Wayne State College. Mr. Reimers will be teaching 9th grade science, Biology, Anatomy, and Physics.

Mr. Mark Bejot has been hired as the new Superintendent. Mr. Bejot comes to us from Wakeeney, Kansas, where he served as Superintendent at Unified School District (USD) 208, for three years. Prior to that, he served for nine years as principal of the Alternative Education program at USD 443 in Dodge City, Kansas. He also has experience as a principal and as a Vocational Agriculture instructor.

Mr. Bejot is a graduate of Seward High School and has received degrees from University of Nebraska, Lincoln, Kansas State University, and Fort Hays State University.

New immunization requirements for 2011-2012 school year

Starting August 2011, all students kindergarten through 12th grade will be required by Nebraska law to have 2 doses of varicella vaccine (Chickenpox) or show written proof of having had the chicken pox disease. Please have your child vaccinated as soon as possible, if they are in need of a second shot. If your child has had the chickenpox disease, you will need to complete a Documentation of Varicella Form which requires the year of the disease and a parent/guardian signature. Proof of vaccination or of chickenpox disease must be turned in to school by August 26, 2011.

Please make an appointment with your health care provider to receive the varicella vaccine if you have not already done so. The next Goldenrod Hills shot clinic in Wakefield will be on August 22 from 11:00-2:00. You may call Goldenrod Hills at their Wisner office at 529-3513 to make an appointment.

If you have any questions, please contact me, Angie Borg RN, at school at 287-9892. I will be available at school on Tuesdays and Thursdays beginning Aug 16. I will be mailing letters to those families that need to have their child immunized or that need to sign the Documentation of Varicella Form.

Additional Immunization Reminder

All students entering 7th grade are required by Nebraska law to have a Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) booster. Proof of immunization is needed by August 26, 2011.



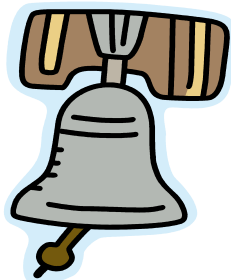
From the Principal's Pen

Welcome back! Wakefield Elementary School is excited about the 2011-12 school year and the great things that are ahead. Over the summer many maintenance projects were completed as well as the yearly "cleaning" that has to be done. This school year proves to be a great one with exciting opportunities for students, staff, and the community. As always, we encourage you to talk to your child about the great things that are happening at school.

New school year starts with flag raising and bell ringing

Students in grades K-12 will begin the new school year on Tuesday, Aug. 16 with the annual flag raising ceremony at 8:15 a.m., followed by the traditional ringing of the school bell by incoming 6th graders.



You will notice that our pre-school students will not be in attendance that morning. After discussions with staff members and administration, we have pushed back the start date for preschoolers by two days. This will allow ample time for our staff members to complete their required home visits.

As a reminder, elementary school hours are 8:15-3:35. Students should be in their classrooms ready for the day to begin at this time.

New staff members...

Wakefield Elementary School is excited to announce three new staff members for the upcoming school year.

Mrs. Micaela Hight will be a new pre-school teacher. Mrs. Tina Sharpe will be moving to 1st grade and Mr. Austin Galles will be a 6th grade teacher and teaching English to students in grades 4-6. We are excited to have these three join our Wakefield team.

Immunizations...

All students must be up-to-date with their immunizations or see the school nurse to complete the necessary waiver forms. Nurse Borg is in the building on Tuesdays and Thursdays. If you have any questions or comments regarding shots or shot records, please contact her to discuss your concerns. In addition to current shot records, the school must have a copy of the official birth certificate. If you do not have an official copy, please contact the state of birth to get one. This process could take a few weeks, so it is good to get started.

Elementary curriculum includes new math series

A group of teachers worked diligently last year to look at our strengths and weaknesses in the area of mathematics. This group identified multiple textbook options and piloted various programs in their individual classrooms.

After much discussion, we selected a new math series that best meets the needs of our learners. *enVisions* is a differentiated approach to teaching mathematics to varying levels of students. Students who need additional intervention or support, students who are at grade level, and those students above grade level in math will be provided with ample opportunities to develop their math skills.

We will continue implementing *Treasures* as our reading series. After looking at data and discussing student performance, we are very happy with the decision to purchase this series. In addition to our core curriculum, we have supplemental support in place to provide additional intervention or enrichment for all students.

New school year will see changes in lunch room for elementary students

This year you will notice some changes in the lunch room procedures and processes as compared to other years. First of all, students will walk down the

primary hallway to wait in line as opposed to the congestion that takes place in the lunch room. Elementary students will have all food served to them. If they do not want it, they have the option to pass. Students will not need to stop at the salad bar before they sit down to enjoy their meal.



Perhaps the biggest difference will be changes in the snacks that may be purchased after lunch. Elementary students will not be allowed to purchase snacks on a daily basis. Instead, students may choose to bring money on Fridays to purchase a snack as long as their lunch has been eaten.
